Howard W. Baker

September 16, 1942 - January 11, 2008



Passed away on Friday, January 11, 2008 at Captain William Jackman Memorial Hospital in Labrador City surrounded by his family and friends.

He was born in Catalina, Trinity Bay and lived there until he completed high school. Then, at the age of 16, he moved to Brakes Cove to work as a schoolteacher for a few years. After brief stints working in Labrador City in 1962-64 and studying at Memorial University in 1964, he officially began his employment at the Iron Ore Company of Canada on January 15, 1965. During his 35 years at IOC, he completed several trades qualifications, including Industrial Mechanic (Millwright), Auto Mechanic, and Heavy Duty Repair, and worked in many areas of the project. On May 1, 2000, he retired and continued to reside in Labrador City.

Over his many years living in Labrador, Howard came to love this land. His favourite pastimes, hunting and fishing, emerged from his love of the outdoors and occupied much of his free time, especially after his retirement.

Howard was a remarkable man who showed great courage and strength in the face of adversity. His pleasant demeanor and uncomplaining attitude, even during his illness, will be remembered by all who knew him. As a husband and father, he was loving and generous; willing to do anything to make his family's lives better.

He is survived by his wife of 41 years, Netta (Kinden), son Dean, daughters Tina and Krista, and grandchildren John and Sarah. Also survived by his mother Agnes (Ricketts), sister Anna, and countless other relatives and friends. He was predeceased by his father Edward.

Visitation took place at Penney's Funeral Home, Labrador City, on Sunday, January 13, 2008, from 2-4 pm and 7-9 pm. A beautiful funeral service took place on Monday, January 14, 2008 at 2pm at the Basilica of Our Lady of Perpetual Help in Labrador City with Father Hahn Van Tran and Father Neil Haight officiating.

Interment followed at the Labrador City Interfaith Cemetery.
